TECHNICAL RULES



- Players and coaches must bring their accreditation cards (no accreditation cards = no play)
- FIFA ISF Rules
- Duration for the match:
 - o 2 x 30 mins for boys and girls
 - o 2 x 40 mins for the two finals
- Half-time interval of 10 minutes
- Players 18 max on the match sheet
- During the match, teams are allowed to use all substitutes, but in a maximum of three stops of the game per match, with more substitutes able to be made at half time.
- Substitutions : In every match all the substitutes (7) can play
- Substitutions: Coach has to inform the local technical members before the substitution.

SYSTEM OF PLAY:

- First part of the competition: Qualification games ingroups(all x all)
- Second part of the competition: Classification games by a knockout system (quarter-final, semi-final, ranking ands final)

For example:

- Quarter boys
 - A1#C1 B1#D1 E1#G1 F1#H1
 - A2#C2 B2#D2 E2#G2 F2#H2
- Quarter girls
 - A1#C2 A2#C1 B1#D2 B2#D1
 - A3#C4 A4#C3 B3#D4 B4#D3
- For boys:

29 teams /5 groups with 4 teams, 3 Groups with 3 teams. For ranking from 25 to 29 a tournament will be organise with the 5 teams 4th of each group.

First a draw will be organise with the 5 teams:

2 matches and an exempt team

The winners of the 2 matches and the exempt team play a tournament from places 25 to 27, and the losers of the 2 first matches will play a match for places 28 and 29

• For girls:

Crossing groups, 1st of group to 2nd of an other group, the same for the 3rd and the 4th of each group. 5th ranked teams from group A and B (5th) will play matches for 17th and 18th places.

TECHNICAL RULES



POINTS:

• Win: 3 points / Draw: 1 point / Match Lost: 0 point

Match lost by default : 0 point (0-3)

RANKING SYSTEM:

First part of competition – at the end of the qualification games (group)

- 1. Points after all matches of group phase
- 2. Result of game between the two equal teams
- 3. Goals difference in all matches of group phase
- 4. More goals scored in the case that the difference between the goals scored and received goals is the same
- 5. Yellow cards (-1 point) and Red cards (-3 points) received in all matches of group phase
- 6. Draw

PENALTIES:

Second part of the competition - classification games

If, after the standard time in classification games, a match ends in a draw, kicks from the PENALTY mark will be taken to determine the winner with the following procedure:

The referee chooses the goal at which the kicks will be taken. The referee tosses a coin and the team whose captain wins the toss decides whether to take the first or the second kick;

- Subject to the conditions explained below, both teams take five kicks. The kicks are taken alternately by the teams;
- If, before both teams have taken five kicks, one has scored more goals than the other could score even if it were to complete its five kicks, no more kicks are taken;
- If, after both teams have taken five kicks, both have scored the same number of goals, or have not scored any
 goals, kicks continue to be taken until one team has scored a goal more than the other from the same number
 of kicks:
- All players who finish the game are authorized to take the penalty kicks. Each kick is taken by a different player and all eligible players must take a kick before any player take a second kick;

If, at the end of the match and before the kicks start to be taken from the penalty mark, one team has a greater number of players, than its opponents, it must reduce its numbers to equate with that of its opponents and the team captain must inform the referee of the name and number of each player excluded.

TECHNICAL RULES



YELLOW CARD / RED CARD

If a player is penalized with two yellow cards during the same match (red card) He has to leave the match, he will be suspended in the following match of his team.

- If the player get two yellow card in two different game, automatically he cannot play in the following match for his team.
- The yellow card count is erased after the end of the group phase, unless the second yellow card is shown to a player during the last game in group stage. In that case he cannot play in the semi final.
- In case of red card suspension, the player will not play in the next game and the Disciplinary Commission can decide to suspend the athlete for more than one match in the case of a serious offense.

Be careful: Yellow and red cards give some points of penalties. They will used if two teams are level at the end group matches

1 Yellow card: 1 point1 Redcard: 3 points

EQUIPMENT:

- The teams will have to be provided with two sets of numbered shirts of different colour.
- If two teams have the same colour of shirt before the match, the second team in the fixture must change shirts.
- Shirt numbers from 1 to 99 shall be used. All players shall wear the same shirt number throughout the whole tournament.
- Participating teams must bring their own bibs.
- Each player must wear shin guards.

Bracelets, rings, piercing Are absolutely forbidden even protected

OTHER RULES:

- All teams must show up at the competition venue not later than 15 minutes before the scheduled beginning of the match.
- In case a team shows up later than 5 minutes after the scheduled beginning of the match, it will automatically lose the match by 0-3.
- In case a team fails to show up, it will automatically lose the match by 0-3.
- 1 Cooling break mini in each half (after 15 min played)
- The official competition balls size 5 must be according to the FIFA rules.
- · Participating teams must bring their own bibs

REFEREES:

The competition will be led by national and international referees

PROTESTS ANS APPEALS:

• Appeals involving results or any matter no concerning discipline will be heard by the Appeal Jury. The appeal must be lodged within 30 minutes of the incident and be submitted in English to the TC. The payment of amount 50€must accompany the appeal and is to be paid to LOC in cash. This payment will be refunded only if the appeal is upheld or at the discretion of the Appeal Jury. In the case of an unsuccessful appeal, the payment will be retained by the ISF.

We believe that children have the inner resources if educated, to fully understand, identify and react in front of negative behavior such as racism, gender inequity or violence and abuse. The challenge for ISF is to find the right way to express difficult ideas and present complicated topics to young people in order for them, not only to understand but also to appropriately apprehend this issue and be able to react if facing it.

Creating awareness and giving the opportunity for the participants to able to transfer their knowledge when getting back home to their peers is also key to ISF.

Using storytelling, technical basic information, and fostering discussion, the Safeguarding workshop aims to give a clear understanding of the issues surrounding safeguarding in sport. It also aims to give youngsters the knowledge to identify and name abusive behaviours and understand how to react in such cases.

And finally, this class aims to give young people the tools to understand that it's not their fault, that they can ask for help, and where to find help.

By emphasizing the importance of honesty, integrity, and personal responsibility, anti-doping education contributes to the moral development of young athletes. It encourages them to make informed choices, stand up against cheating, and develop a strong sense of integrity that extends beyond the realm of sports and into other aspects of their lives. anti-doping education plays a crucial role in shaping the attitudes and behaviors of young people involved in sports.

Educating them about the risks, consequences, and ethical implications of doping, promotes health, fair play, and integrity while providing them with the necessary tools to make informed decisions that align with their long-term well-being and athletic aspirations.

The law and the rules are important, but it is not just rules that safeguard our sport for clean athletes, but also the measures and processes that help put those rules into action. We must all play our part in promoting fair play and that means gaining an appreciation of what leads to certain decisions being made.







Morocco travel adaptors

You will need to consider what to pack, to ensure you can use your personal electrical appliances safely whilst abroad. This normally includes the use of a travel adaptor, which is a device that simply allows you to plug any UK electrical appliance into a foreign electrical socket. It is important to note that it does not convert the voltage or frequency.

For Morocco there are two associated plug types, types C and E. Plug type C is the plug which has two round pins and plug type E is the plug which has two round pins and a hole for the socket's male earthing pin. Morocco operates on a 220V supply voltage and 50Hz.





The Moroccan dirham is the official monetary currency of Morocco. It is issued by the Bank Al-Maghrib, the central bank of Morocco. One Moroccan dirham is subdivided into 100 santimat.
